**December 26, 2018**

**Village Administrator**

-On December 13 the Village of Tuscarawas toured the Scio water treatment facility. The tour was conducted to assist the Village with preparations for their new water treatment plant and types of filter media available.

-Annual cost of testing requirements for 2018 is \$2415.00.

**WWTP:**

-The NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit). The VA and ORC have had a meeting to review and start the application process.

-A new chain was installed in the clarifier building, additional work will be needed in 2019.

-Per the OEPA inspection report from 2018 on the WWTP, the Village is required to have portable generator power available for the lift stations by 2021. Recommend a committee meeting to start the process to allocate funds and identify what all the requirements will be for a portable system.

-Annual cost of testing requirements for 2018 are \$11,508.00.

**OEPA**

-Please read both letters from the OEPA located in your packets. These are very good news for the Village.

-A conference call is being scheduled for Jan 3rd or 4th to discuss the ortho-phosphate feed at the WTP.

**RCAP**

-Webinar training is offered at no cost to the Village. The VA highly recommends that council and other elected officials attend these sessions at their leisure. RCAP 301 February 26-28 Asset Management, Budgeting, and Rate Settings for local officials is a three part webinar series. Elected officials and employees can sign up for classes at [www.OHIORCAP.ORG](http://www.OHIORCAP.ORG), sign-ups are on the training page.

**Buildings**

-Disposal of the old Village building in 2019; recommend a land and business meeting in early 2019.

**Quicksall and Associates**

-A phone conference was held on December 17 at 10:30 with Erin at Quicksall. The Village has made it past the first round and is pending at the small government grant.

More details and information will be known in late January.

**Roadways and Structures**

RUMA- The RUMA is projected to start in Spring 2019; traffic is limited to Cemetery Road. Times will be limited to 6am to 10pm.

**General**

-Water/ waste water rates for 2019- a 2.5% increase will be effective Jan 1, 2019 as per the Village Ordinance. Depending on testing and chemical costs, the set increases are recommended to be reviewed in August of 2019 for the 2020 calendar year.

-Clothing allowance for employees: a \$400 annual allowance is recommended per employee for work clothing and foot wear since the Village has canceled the contract for work clothing as a cost savings measure.

-Legal; Mr. Mathews is preparing paperwork for the Village, called and anticipate something after the holiday season.

**December 12, 2018**

**Scio Village Council** met in regular session on December 12, 2018 at 6 pm with Mayor Michelle Carpenter leading the Pledge to the flag.

Members present were Erin Thompson, Ron Wright, Andrew Turner, Carol Davy, Heidi Trice and Betty Gotschall. Others included, Water/WW & Income Tax Adm Janeen Scott and Clerk-Treasurer Trish Copeland as well as Village Administrator Jason Tubaugh. J.D. Long of the News-Herald was present. Solicitor Jackson was unable to attend.

Turner moved to approve minutes from the previous meeting as presented and Gotschall seconded; all present voted yes. Motion carried.

#### **Clerk-Treasurer**

Called council's attention to the appropriations she had adjusted. Copeland said she would be sending the changes to the auditor's office.

#### **Village Administrator**

##### **WTP Project:**

- The project was completed in November 2018. This project was completed ahead of schedule.
- The WTP is operating completely on the new system.
- On December 13th the Village of Tuscarawas will be touring the new facility.

##### **WWTP:**

- The NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit) issued by the OEPA for the WWTP will be submitted in February 2019. The cost will be \$200 to the Village. The submission is required 180 days prior to the expiration of the current permit. The VA and ORC have scheduled a meeting to review and complete the application.
- The clarifier building at the WWTP will require maintenance in 2019. The flights, sprocket, chain and scraper will need replaced on the sludge collection system.
- Per the OEPA inspection report from 2018 on the WWTP, the Village is required to have portable generator power available for the lift stations by 2021.

##### **OEPA**

- The final monthly status report on the WTP upgrade project was sent on December 5, 2018 to the OEPA SEDO, IAW with our bilateral agreement. The Village has submitted all required documentation to the OEPA, we have requested that all findings and orders be rescinded as of December 31, 2018. Anticipate correspondence within 30 to 60 days.
- December 10th the Village had an unscheduled OEPA spot visit to the WTP. The VA conducted a site visit with both EPA reps, explained the implemented new equipment and plant operations. The site visit lasted approximately 40 minutes.

##### **RCAP**

- Contingency plan training was held December 12th from 0830-1430 at Sally Buffalo park, the VA and Ron Thompson attended this free training to fulfill the annual -requirement.
  - Webinar training is offered at no cost to the Village. The VA highly recommends that council and other elected officials attend these sessions at their leisure.

### **Quicksall and Associates**

The Grant application is pending for Phase II of the Capital Improvement Plan.

A phone conversation was held on December 11, 2018, they anticipate grant results early next week. A phone call is scheduled for December 17 at 10:30 with Erin at Quicksall Engineering to discuss results and possible options.

### **Roadways and Structures**

RUMA- -Shell Pipeline has deposited the \$25,000 holding for any possible damage to Village utilities for a period of 36 months. The RUMA is projected to start in Spring 2019

### **General**

Legal; Mr. Mathews is preparing paperwork for the Village.

Cell phones were again discussed and the consensus is that T-Mobile is probably the best route for the village to take. Ms. Trice moved to go with T-Mobile with two lines (or 4) based on the cost of the hot spot. Thompson seconded and roll call showed the results as: Thompson, yea; Wright, yea; Turner, yea; Davy, yea; Gotschall, yea; Trice, yea, motion carried.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Due to Jackie & Chuck Greene questioning their decision (at the 11/28/18 meeting) pertaining to Lee St., Turner recommended taking the area of the Hidey & Dowdle section OFF of the UN-maintained area of said Lee Street.

Davy mentioned a clarification of the 7% raise for Village Adm. Jake Tubaugh and all agreed the amount should have covered both positions. Davy moved to make the raise for both the Village Adm. position AND the WTP as the amount should have covered both. Turner seconded. Roll call: Thompson, yea; Wright, yea; Turner, yea; Davy, yea; Gotschall, yea; Trice, yea, motion carried.

Ron Wright moved to have Jake look at another truck, not over 1 year old, that will serve the village's needs-Erin Thompson seconded. Roll call reflected: Thompson, yea; Wright, yea; Turner, yea; Davy, yea; Gotschall, yea; Trice, yea, motion carried.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Tubaugh mentioned that water licensing classes will begin in 2019. The village needs to send someone to these classes and specify that whomever goes to those classes will repay the village should the employee leave prior to a set time of employment after completion of said classes.

Davy questioned whether Scio has heard from the school board about any pieces of land close to the park that the board says belongs to the village.

Everyone decided the next meeting on December 26, 2018 will be held as previously scheduled.

December 12, 2018

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The Mayor brought up employee Christmas bonuses - no action taken.

Wright moved to approve the Financial Report and Thompson seconded. Roll call: Thompson, yea; Turner, yea; Gotschall, yea; Wright, yea; Trice, yea; Davy, yea. Motion carried.

Wright moved to pay the bills as presented and seconded by Thompson. Roll call reflected: Thompson, yea; Wright, yea; Turner, abstain; Davy, yea; Gotschall, yea; Trice, yea, motion carried.

As Adopted at Regular Meeting of March 28, 2018

**Water Line Replacement and Paving Projects:**

Phase I- Second Street in between Carrollton Street and Eastport Street in 2017 (Completed)

The Village will purchase the material and bid the labor work to a local contractor.

Phase II - Second Street from Eastport to Custer Way alley to encompass all cross streets such as School House junction and Masonic Way, projected date 2019 for initial planning and cost assessment - engineering and grant possibilities for upgraded line from a four inch to a six inch line

Phase III- Proposed engineering and grant feasibility for Eastport Street

This would encompass the intersection of SR 151 (Main Street) and Eastport to the intersection of Carrollton Street 2020

Phase IV- Maple and Walnut Street 2021

Engineering and grant proposal for upgrading from a 4 inch main line to a 6 inch main line for proper fire coverage and removal of any lead joints, fixtures, and service lines.

Phase V- Eastport Street

Eastport from the intersection of West College St. to the intersection of Crimm Road 2022-2023

Engineering services and grant possibilities, move the existing four inch water line to the sidewalk area and replace it with a new six inch line - replace any fire hydrants that are needed.

Phase VI- Brown Street / Elm Street / Grandview Street from West College St. to the village limit at Cemetery Road  
Replace existing line with new C900 plastic - repave as needed

Proposed for 2024

**Lift Station Upgrades:**

East Port Lift Station

New T6 pump 2017

Proposed second new T6 pump installation in 2019 with new control panel and instruments, well casing inspection

College Lift Station

New T6 pump purchase and install in 2018 [\$14,000 purchase price has already been approved]

Proposed second new T6 pump installation in 2020 with new control panel and well casing inspection

Church St Lift Station

Currently up to specs / Recommend in 2025 a possible overhaul if needed of existing equipment

Water Treatment Plant

-Filter media - Recommend testing on filter media in 2025 to assess its expected shelf life

-Well #1 and #2 - Well cleaning and assessment of pumps and associated equipment to be conducted per manufacturer's guidelines in 2026 (every 7-10 years)

-Aerator, Tanks, and surface pumps - Condition assessment, maintenance, and service life inspection in summer of 2023 (every 5 years)

-Water Storage Tank - Inspection and cleaning required in 2022 (every 5 years per EPA guidelines)

-EZ chemical pumps- Inspected, repaired or replaced every 12 months (estimated cost \$680 per pump) The WTP will have 4 pumps in service and 4 spares on hand

-Schedule 80 pipe-Plumbing is rated for 40 year life span at 120 PSI, inspect annually

-Additional equipment and inspections will be required with the upgrade project in 2018

Wastewater Treatment Plant:

- New T4 pumps installed in 2016 - inspect and possible rebuild in 2024, replace in 2036 (20 year usable life span)
- Clarifiers - In need of new weirs, flights, new chains and possible sprockets (replace every 10-15 yrs.)
- Digesters- Inspect annually, repair or replace as needed (associated equipment and bubbler)
- Inner and outer oxidation ditches- Repairs done in 2015-2016 / Inspect concrete walls annually - repair as needed. Drain each oxidation ditch every two years for inspection, cleaning, and repair as needed. Alternate between each ditch to ensure both are cleaned and inspected every two years
- Screw Screen - inspect semi-annually. Replace brushes annually or as needed
- Generator - Inspect annually and service (they are diesel engines)
- 3 way Valves - inspect annually
- Inner and outer paddle wheels - estimated life span of 5 yrs. before rebuild is required / recommend one spare on hand for emergency repair if needed

Vehicles:

- WWTP Service Truck - 2005 Chevy 2500 4x2 (bought in 2012)
  - Street Department Truck - 2006 Dodge Ram 2500 4x4 (bought in 2014)
  - Backhoe
  - Plow Truck - 2009 F450 requires a new bed (bought in 2008) [New truck price \$60,000 to \$70,000?]
  - Tractor - New 2016 Massey Ferguson 4x4 with brush hog
- A vehicle replacement program is recommended for every 5 years.

Lawn equipment:

- JD diesel mower with new (2018) mower deck
- Zero turn Toro mower - 2014 model
- Small JD lawn mower- 2009 model (Needs replaced)
- Various weed eaters: replaced as needed
